## President's Message

We have been discussing Norfolk Woodlot Owners Association (NWOA) becoming a Chapter of Ontario Woodlot Association (OWA) for a couple of years. Finally, we have a conclusion. On October 12, 2022, the members of NWOA strongly voted in favour of becoming a Chapter of OWA. We are now known as Norfolk Woodlot Owners Association Chapter of Ontario Woodlot Association or Norfolk Chapter.

NWOA yearend is Dec 31, which is the same as OWA yearend. The difference in membership renewal is OWA starts the renewal of membership reminders in October, while NWOA waits until the following March. So now that NWOA Chapter is part of OWA, NWOA members can expect notices, from OWA, for the annual membership dues for 2023 of \$56.50 (including HST) membership fee. The OWA membership fee includes the NWOA annual membership fee.

There are many pros for NWOA to be a Chapter of OWA and consequently, all NWOA members are also members of OWA.
